# Chess Club Accomplishments This Year

- Spicewood Elementary Chess Club continues to be a top local scholastic program
- Many students participated in and won individual and team trophies at local scholastic tournaments
- Started club meetings two weeks earlier than normal and it made a big difference at the first tournament of the season
- Held 36 club meetings over the school year which is an increase of 6 compared to last year



- Integrated chess <u>training videos</u> into our club meetings to focus on openings, tactics and strategy
- Continue to improve and post news on our website (<u>spicewoodchess.org</u>)



# **Chess Club Accomplishments This Year - continued**



- Opened the Spicewood Chess Club <u>Chess Store</u> twice, which is probably the most popular aspect of Chess Club for many students!
- Held a movie event with a showing of "Searching for Bobby Fischer"
- Organized an 8 week advanced training class that 15 club members participated.
- Renewed membership with <u>Chesskid.com</u> for the year and integrated its use during our weekly club meetings
- Purchased a <u>preamp</u> to improve the sound system in the library (\$56)



# **Chess Skill Groups**

• This year, we consolidated and renamed our chess skill groups into four groups:

<u>Pawns</u> – Beginner

<u>Knights</u> – Intermediate

Rooks - Advanced

<u>Kings</u> – Expert

• We also worked to generate a skills checklist for each group to work on throughout the year.









# **Club T-shirt**

- We used a previous design for this year's club t-shirt. It was designed by club member Ethan Yang when he was in 1<sup>st</sup> grade (now 4<sup>th</sup>) and it was first used during the 2012-13 school year.
- We purchased 164 youth and 67 adult shirts for \$700.67 printed by Austin Screen Print (~\$3 per shirt)
- 48 T-shirts were given to Spicewood staff and Chess club volunteers to promote the chess club
- 9 Adult T-shirts were purchased by parents (\$3 each)





# **Chess Library**


- The Chess Club has a collection of <u>chess training books</u> that the students can check out during the school year
- We have 12 different books offered and in total, we have 167 books that can be checked out
- It is a great resource for the students and we thank Chris Mason for being our librarian this year

































## **Chess Folders**

- Last year, we noticed many of our chess club folders were getting lost or damaged over time.
- We decided to purchase plastic folders that are more durable and have a built in pocket for the kids to store their earned Chess Bucks.
- These folders are ~\$4 each, so we plan to collect them at the end of the year to reuse next year.
- We also utilized the central binding to provide each skill group with appropriate worksheets and training materials.

# **Chess Clocks**

- The use of a Chess clock is essential for the students that attend tournaments
- The club has a total of <u>44 chess clocks</u> for the students to use during our club meetings



# **Advanced Training Class**

- During the Spring semester, we organized an 8 week training class that met at the same time as our Friday club meetings
- The class was led by Kannan Kaliyur and his two sons, Rohith and Shreyes in the Science lab
- We limited the class to 15 slots which filled quickly and helped students receive more individualized training
- It was a great success and we look forward organizing more of these classes next year.












# Chesskid.com

- A single gold membership costs \$49 per year. Discounts are given to <u>bulk purchases</u>
- The club purchased 75 gold memberships which were used throughout the year (\$499)
- This gives students access to full video training, lessons, workouts, puzzles and articles
- We began allowing students to use Chesskid.com during club meetings in the Spring
- We hope the students continue to use this resource over the summer break

#### Chess in Art

The iconography of chess and checkered surfaces has influenced art through the ages. Especially after 1000, when checkered surfaces also became connected to the chessboard. Chess became a source of inspiration in the arts in literature soon after the spread of the game to the Arab World and Europe in the Middle Ages. The earliest works of art centered on the game are miniatures in medieval manuscripts, as well as poems, which were often created with the purpose of describing the rules. After chess gained popularity in the 15th and 16th centuries, many works of art related to the game were created.



- Fun pages showing unique Chess sets and Chess game variations.




# 2014-2015 Club Statistics


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




# Attendance

# **Common Chess Club Expenses**

- List of common annual Chess Club expenses:
  - Club T-shirts (~\$700-\$1200)
  - Printing fees for handouts, worksheets, folders, Chess Bucks, bookmarks, book labels, training materials for coaches, etc. (~\$1000)
  - Chesskid membership fee (\$500 per year for 75 gold accounts)
  - Food and drinks for weekend events (2 to 4 events per year, \$250 each event)
  - Chess Store items (~\$1500)
  - School sponsor faculty gift (\$200)
  - New chess sets (\$12-\$20 per set)
  - New chess books (\$10-\$30 per book)
  - New chess clocks (\$40-\$50 per clock)



# **Tentative Plans for Next Year**

- Here is a list of things the club leadership would like to implement or improve next year:
  - More coaches and better specialized training for each skill group
  - Better tracking of student chess skills
  - Library setup for chess club on Thursday afternoon to save time Friday mornings
  - Increased use of chess notation during meetings
  - Increased use of chess clocks during meetings
  - Increased participation in local tournaments
  - Incentives for checking out and reading books from our chess library (have students pass a quiz after reading for Chess Bucks rewards)
  - Repair and cleanup giant outside playground chess set
  - Better utilize online training resources on ChessKid.com with Chess Bucks incentives
  - Design contest over the summer for new Tshirt
  - Chess Club Banner for the fence along Anderson Mill


